### REVIVAL ROAD

- In 2025, our staff members drove a combined 67,000 miles. This included meetings in 20 states.
- Our two revival teams held a total of 46 revivals, supply preaching 25 times and all staff served together at the Enduring Light Preaching Camp held at Mid South Christian College in July.
- At RSM events in 2025, there were 353 public decisions, including 13 baptisms.

## TWO MILESTONES IN 2025

### 50 YEARS

Reflecting on half a century of ministry is both humbling and exhilarating. Fifty-one years ago, I answered a calling that would shape the course of my life, lead me places I never dreamed I would go, and bring me face to face with countless lives hungry for hope and direction. Fifty years ago, I began preaching every Sunday. Marking 50 years in ministry is not so much about a milestone for Beth and me as it is a testament to the unwavering grace of God.

Our journey began with a simple conviction: to serve, love, and share the message of the Gospel. In those formative years, the path was not always easy. There were moments of doubt, seasons of scarcity, and many challenges that tested our resolve. Yet, every hurdle became an opportunity for growth. Years of service have taught me that true ministry is not about numbers or accolades, but about touching hearts, listening deeply, and walking alongside my brothers and sisters on the “narrow path”.

Over the past five decades, ministry has bestowed upon us numerous unforgettable experiences. We have witnessed depravity in the human heart, yet more profoundly, we have witnessed the divine glory of God. We have observed the power of prayer, the splendor of worship, and the unwavering strength and influence that emerge when God’s people unite in a common goal of reaching their community for Christ.

Milestones have taken many forms: baptizing penitent believers into Christ, helping launch new churches, mentoring young leaders, and seeing individuals step into their own callings. These moments were more than triumphs; they became sacred markers of God’s faithfulness and the impact of focused ministry.

### 500+ REVIVALS

Along with RSM co-laborers Greg & Lori Strickland, we have conducted more than 760 Rock Solid Revivals, 500 of which I have preached. Leading 500 revivals is a feat I could never have imagined back in 2004! Each gathering has been unique, marked by its own challenges and victories. Some revivals have been in grand auditoriums, others were held in community centers, and humble one-room rural church houses. Regardless of size or setting, the common thread (in most situations), has been a thirst for spiritual renewal and a desire for transformation.

What really stands out in my mind is not the total number of revivals, but the individual stories: the comfort found in grief, hope rekindled, countless souls who’ve discovered purpose and peace in Christ, and congregations that have shifted their focus from maintenance to mission. Revivals, at their core, are about rekindling hope and sparking lasting change. My role was simply to be a vessel—to preach, pray, and watch God move in ways I never could have orchestrated.

### LOOKING AHEAD: CONTINUING THE JOURNEY

As Beth and I celebrate these milestones, I am reminded that ministry is never really finished. There are always new people to reach, new communities to serve, and new challenges to embrace. My prayer is that the next chapter will be marked by the same passion, energy, enthusiasm, and dependence on God that have carried us thus far.

To those who have walked this journey with us—family, friends, congregations, and colleagues—we offer our deepest gratitude. Your encouragement and partnership have been invaluable. To God be the glory for every life changed and every revival ignited. The story continues, and we are honored to play our part in His ongoing work.

## REVIVALS IN TODAY'S CHURCH

Occasionally, congregations that have not hosted a Rock Solid revival—or any revival meeting for some time—begin to question the necessity and relevance of revivals. Some wonder why there would be an expectation for unchurched individuals to attend an evangelistic gathering. Others consider the demands of busy schedules and ask how even committed Church members could be expected to participate during “non-Church” nights, let alone attend each night of a four-day revival. Amid the prevailing emphasis on “relevance” in Church growth circles, many are uncertain if revivals are still appropriate for today’s congregations. Let’s look at those questions, starting with the last question first.

### ARE REVIVALS RELEVANT?

The core issue is whether Bible preaching remains relevant—because that is the focus of every Rock Solid revival meeting. If one believes in the transformative power of God’s Word when it is spoken and heard, it is difficult to imagine anything more relevant. Conversely, if one does not hold this belief, it calls into question the very purpose of attending Church at any time.

### CAN THE UNCHURCHED BE EXPECTED TO ATTEND EVANGELISTIC MEETINGS?

While the attendance of unchurched individuals is uncertain, it is possible—especially with proper preparation. Each Church is provided with a packet of “prayerperation” ideas, and the evangelists are ready to share additional strategies if requested. It is important to remember, however, that revival—though it always includes evangelistic elements—is, by definition, primarily for the Church itself.

### DO CONGREGATIONS NEED REVIVAL?

The answer to this question is an emphatic “Yes!” Preachers benefit from the renewal that comes

from hearing five inspiring messages. Worship leaders and musicians gain respite from their weekly responsibilities and have the chance to worship as part of the congregation. Regular attendees in the pews can experience genuine revival if they engage in the suggested “prayerperation.”

### WILL CHURCH MEMBERS ATTEND, GIVEN THEIR BUSY SCHEDULES?

With proper challenge and preparation, Church members will attend. It is common to see attendance on all four nights equal to or even exceed Sunday morning numbers. Even if not everyone is present, the true value of the meetings—especially with no financial cost involved—lies in what is gained by those who do participate.

### THE SPIRITUAL BATTLE FOR SOUND DOCTRINE

Beyond addressing these questions, the two evangelistic teams are deeply involved in a significant spiritual battle to uphold Biblical doctrine. Unfortunately, many Restoration Movement congregations have become lax in their teaching, or have preachers who, while faithfully proclaiming the truth, face resistance from their own congregants. Both Tom and I are dedicated to reversing this trend and combating doctrinal darkness.

### A CALL TO ACTION

If your congregation has not scheduled a revival meeting, consider making arrangements today. Alternatively, make it a priority to attend a meeting in your area. By joining together, you will have the opportunity to experience renewed faith.
